



Holy Family Conducts a Feasibility Study

This spring, in an attempt to better determine the future direction of the school, Holy Family (HF) retained a consulting firm to conduct a feasibility study. Doing a feasibility study on the heels of becoming debt free was a great opportunity to really focus on the long and short term needs of the school without having to incorporate a mortgage payment into the planning. In fact, the debt had served as a barrier to launching a capital campaign, which HF's administration and the Board of Trustees has believed for years needed to happen.

As part of the feasibility study, many families were invited to participate in a personal interview and even more were selected at random to complete a mail survey. The feasibility study enabled HF to determine potential support for a major fund-raising effort. It helped identify mission-critical information as well as prospective campaign leaders and donors and also helped establish a realistic campaign goal.

Based on the information gathered, some of the observations the consulting firm reported were: There are many positive qualities of HF including the proactive administration; increased enrollment; high academic standards; athletic prowess and the new building, grounds and facilities. Seventy-eight percent (78%) of those surveyed indicated that they are in favor of HF moving forward with a capital campaign to address

the needs of the school and seventy-five percent (75%) of the participants indicated that they would make a personal gift.

The overwhelmingly positive results have lead HF to seriously consider launching a major fundraising endeavor that will encompass a combination of the priorities established in the feasibility study and those outlined in the long range plan. As the school embarks on this exciting journey, please know that HF will be turning to the alumni, parents, parents of alumni, faculty and staff, foundations, corporations, as well as the Catholic community for assistance and support.

Holy Family Retires Debt

April 5th is a day not soon to be forgotten in the Tiger community. On this day, Holy Family (HF) became debt free! An anonymous donor family partnered with the Archdiocese of Denver, and together, they paid off HF's outstanding 3.75 million dollar construction loan.

The big announcement was made public during a pep rally at HF on April 12th. Cheers from the crowd echoed throughout the Tiger hallways. One teacher was overheard saying, "This is the best news ever!" During the rally, Principal Sister Mary Rose Lieb, osf, reminded students that HF has never used operating funds, which come from tuition, to service the debt. She added, "Paying off this loan allows our school to be free to grow, to expand and to focus on the future."

1952 Graduate's Legacy Endures

"If I could wish one wish for you, it would be a love so true" is what **Mary Ann Perito Horan ('54)** wrote of her lifelong love, **Stephen Francis Horan, Sr. ('52)** who passed away on March 13, 1993. They were married for 35 years. Mary Ann's husband may have been the inspiration for her words, but as with any poem, it is written for people to appreciate and to enjoy. Both Stephen and Mary Ann attended Holy Family Grade School and High School. They loved the HF community and Mary Ann knew that even after Stephen's death, her husband would want to somehow continue to support it.

To honor Stephen's memory, the Stephen Francis Horan Sr. Scholarship was created for HF Grade School students. This scholarship awarded \$1,000 to a female and to a male student each year. The criteria for the scholarship was that the students must be athletes, must excel academically and must plan on attending HFHS and playing a sport there as well. Why the emphasis on scholarship recipients being student athletes? Because sports were a big part of Stephen's life. He overcame polio and went on to play football, basketball and was on the boxing team.

Stephen and Mary Ann had many friends and relatives who supported the scholarship. Over 40 individuals and businesses contributed to the initial fund, to show their

love for Stephen, Mary Ann and the HF community. Mary Ann's aunt, Margaret Somma, who was the school secretary for many years, was responsible for creating, coordinating and co-presenting the scholarships year after year, along with her husband, George Somma. Mary Ann said of her Aunt Margaret, "She is a most amazing person and we couldn't have done it without her."

All in all, 22 students received the Stephen Francis Horan Sr. Scholarship and most went on to succeed both academically and athletically at HFHS. Stephen Horan's legacy endures through the successes of these students. The love Stephen and Mary Ann felt towards each other, their church, school, and community also lives on.
